




10. Mere Christianity




8. J. Hudson Taylor

I've read a number of biographies and this is one of my favorites. Roger Steer captures the essence of Hudson Taylor and his ministry in China. This book both challenges and encourages.




7. Preaching and Preachers

by Brian H. Edwards






5. The Case for the Real Jesus




4. The Reason for God




3. Knowing God

Packer's classic work on the nature and attributes of God is one that has been encouraging God's people for decades. I pulled out my copy last year and am going through it again for the second time, it's that good!




2. Discovering the God Who Is
